



Locked Up, Locked Out: Young Men in the Juvenile Justice System (Hardback)

Follows forty juvenile male offenders, from their first-time admissions to the Ohio system through their incarceration and reentry into the community. The author conducted three lengthy interviews with each of these youth over a period of two and a half years. These interviews bring alive their attitudes and day-to-day prison experiences, as well as the intricate connections between life on the inside and life on the outside. Status is key to everyday life in prison, and it is often played out in demonstrations of masculinity, misogyny, and violence. Some gangs and some area codes (as the old neighborhoods are called) are seen as tougher than others and are given more respect. Even letters from family members and girlfriends are important signs of whether a prisoner matters: one young man says, I d write letters every day to people to beg em to write me back. Another reports, There would be people in there writing girls, saying, hey, write me this nasty letter of things we re going to do and things we did. And they d write back with these...
